Dictionary of American Regional English

Introduction

DARE, the Dictionary of American Regional English, documents the way the English language is used across the United States. Entries detail regional variations in pronunciation and usage, and are based both on interviews carried out in all fifty states and on analysis of written materials from the colonial period to the present.

The DARE publishing program has so far produced four of the planned six volumes. Alongside the continuing print program, we are about to commence work on publishing the full DARE database as an online reference resource. As we plan this website, we would welcome your input on how DARE should be presented and used online.

DARE Online is scheduled for launch in 2013.
